THE SNOWY HYDRO 2.0



Brothers/Sisters, At the start of August, I spent a week at the Snowy Hydro 2.0 project at the base of Mount Kosciusko with CFMEU Organiser Johnny Andrikopoulos,

having site meetings with members discussing the importance of safety and sticking fat on the job. Safety is not just a buzzword or a box to tick, one of our Brothers from the MUA explained it the best.

"Every time we cut a corner, then the next bloke cuts a corner, and so forth. Sooner rather than later, there are no more corners to cut and then it's a straight run to a fatality."

On the first stage of the Snowy Hydro that was built between 1947 to 1974, ended in 121 workers losing their lives. 121 families forever ruined, could you imagine?

The members working tirelessly on the Snowy Hydro 2.0 are not just workers, they are the backbone of the biggest Hydroelectricity project in Australia. There is no compromise on the well-being of these members braving the elements to secure Australia's clean energy targets. The Construction Division of our mighty Union stands as a powerful advocate for these workers, fighting for their rights, safety, and fair treatment with Organiser Johnny Andrikopoulos at the forefront supporting these workers 24/7.
