CFMMEU BACKS IN BLUE COLLAR UNIONS OR BEST PRACTICE PRINCIPLES FOR RENEWABLE ENERGY PROJECTS

As Australia strives towards achieving a zero-emissions economy, the pace of transformation to greener alternatives of power such as wind, solar, hydro, and other emerging technologies will continue to gain momentum.

The Renewables industry has the potential to create thousands of maritime and construction jobs around the country, and it is our job to ensure that these projects uphold the core values of unionism - benefiting workers, minority groups and the broader community.

In August, I attended the ALP National conference, and spoke in support of the ETU's motion, calling for the implementation of industry best practice principals for the new energy sector.

These principals cover workers' rights, adequate licencing, the highest standards in occupational health and safety, participation of women, veterans, and First Nations people, as well as addressing local procurement through manufacturing supply chains.

The motion was unanimously endorsed and will be used as a baseline to hold the ALP accountable on a long-lasting clean energy legacy that we are proud of, where no Australian is left behind.
